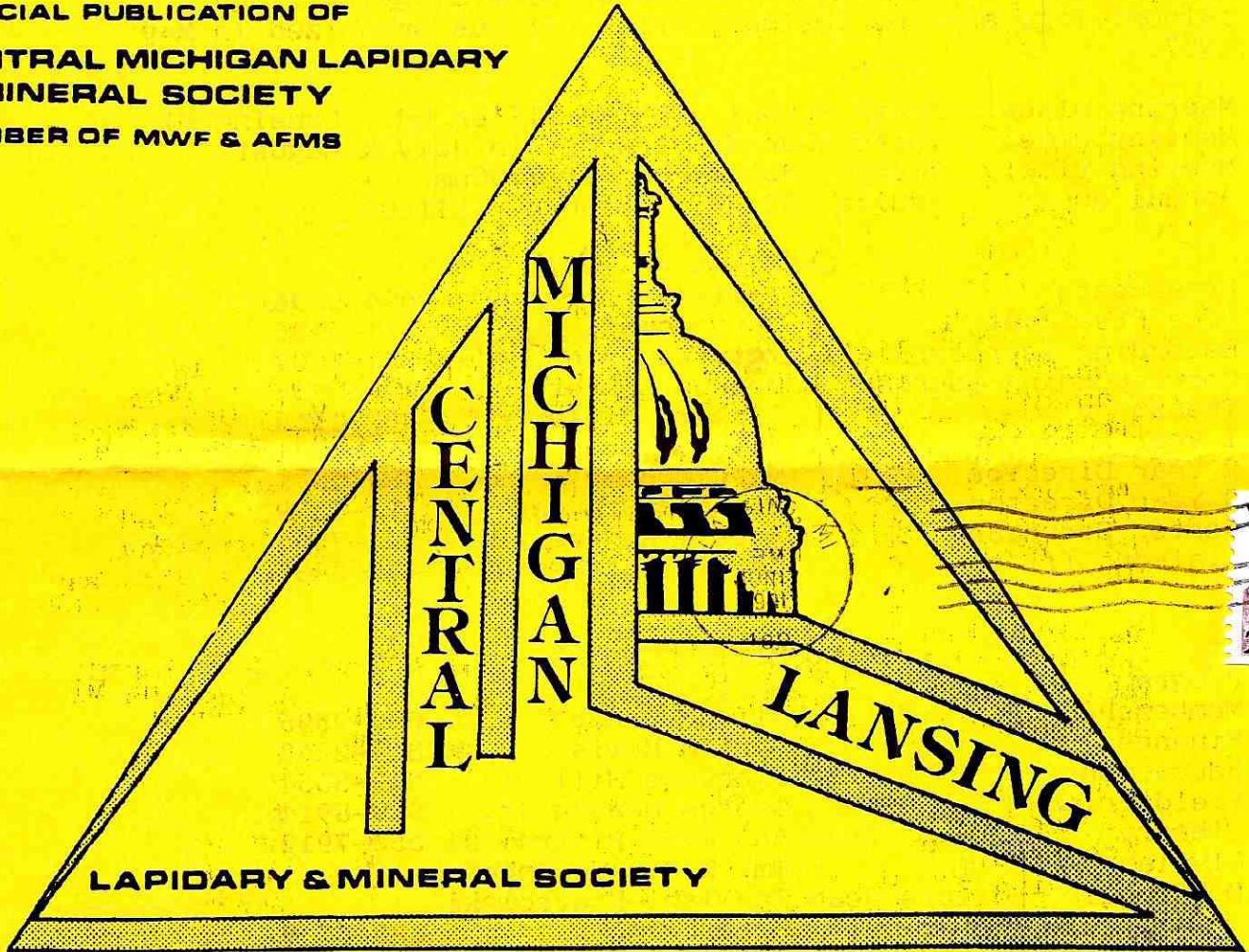

EDUCATION - FLORENCE HILL

Mineral of the month will be columbite.

James Reid, head of the Capital Area Science and Math Center called recently to ask for the help of CML&MS in the Center's plan for teaching earth science in elementary schools. The Center, which has its headquarters in the Ingham Intermediate School District offices near Mason has been working with a committee of nine teachers from the Tri County Area. Mr. Reid's particular request was that our Society provide 12-15 sets of basic rock samples. These would be loaned to a classroom studying rocks and minerals and would be used by teams of two students working together. He mentioned using egg cartons. Basic rocks would call for samples of granite, basalt, sandstone etc. - rocks we don't ordinarily put in our display cases. It would be a good opportunity to brush up on our own information as well as fill a real need. The sets should be ready for use next fall. The Board has approved this project and now we will have to get to work. Below is a list of the rocks that might be used. Please bring your contributions to this project to the June meeting.

DON'T FORGET THE CHILDREN'S TABLE

May 19th Field Trip to Bayport--Our joint field trip and pot-luck picnic with the Scarborough, Ontario Gem and Mineral Club to the Wallace Quarry near Bayport, Michigan attracted a total of 20 rockhounds. We had 10 from our club and 10 from the Scarborough Club. The weather was near perfect for rock hunting being sunny, dry, and cool with a high temperature about 70 degrees.

Some nice calcite specimens were found. A very nice, colorful irridescent calcite was collected by Jennifer Campbell who also found one of the 3 millerite specimens I saw collected. Alnoov Visram of Scarborough found a brown calcite with very nice selenite crystals. Even George Heaton found a few good calcite specimens. Richard and Lila Stevens found some nice pyrite crystals. Neil Snapp collected one of the millerite specimens, but the best millerite specimen I saw collected that day was found by Lois Clarke of Scarborough. George Heaton collected a good number of the small nodules which sometimes contain millerite. He has not opened any of them yet.

Our pot-luck picnic which followed the visit to the Wallace Quarry was held in the park at Sebewing. Lots of good food was available.

Included among other good things were some delicious chicken wings, a wonderful orange jello fruit and nut salad, and a loaf of pumpkin bread.

JUNE FIELD TRIP, BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, JUNE 21-23

The June field trip will include the Bedford Rock Swap, now held at the Monroe County 4H Fairgrounds in Bloomington, Indiana, and geode collecting at the road cut at the Harrodsburg Exit on Route 37, June 21-23. To get to the rock swap at the 4H Fairgrounds you go south on Rt. 37 to the intersection of Rt. 37 and Rt. 45. You turn right on Rt. 45 and go southwest on Rt. 45 about 1 2/10 miles, then turn right and go 7/10 mile on Airport Road.

This is a very large and interesting rock swap which attracts swappers from surrounding states and Ontario, Canada. Camping is allowed on the Fairgrounds, and motels are located in Bloomington. The geodes from Harrodsburg are beautiful and may contain several minerals including quartz, calcite, dolomite, millerite, barite, pyrite and sphalerite.

To collect the geodes at the Harrodsburg road cut you should have at least a 2-3 lb. crack hammer and several sharp chisels. Heavier hammers, pry bars and more chisels of all sizes are very useful. The geodes are in limestone, so it can be hard work to chisel them out and you can dull your supply of chisels very quickly. (Please don't forget your safety equipment!! It is likely that you will be working under overhangs, and doing a bit of climbing. Be prepared rather than injured!

To get to Bloomington, go south on I-69 to Indianapolis, then on I-465 south to Rt. 37. Go south on Rt. 37 to Bloomington.

Field Trip to Hungry Hollow

The field trip for July will be to Hungry Hollow near Arkona, Ontario on Saturday, July 27. The Hungry Hollow field trip will be for fossils and the fossils are usually plentiful at Hungry Hollow. We will meet at the north end of the steel bridge over the Ausable River at Hungry Hollow at 10:00 AM, Saturday, July 27.

To get there from Lansing, take Rt. 69 east to Rt. 94 at Port Huron. Go north on I-94 about 5 miles to the Blue Water Bridge, which crosses the St. Clair River to Sarnia, Ontario. The Bridge is a toll bridge and costs 75 cents for passenger cars, small trucks and vans. After crossing the bridge and going through customs, the expressway Rt. 402 is right in front of you. Take 402 east from Sarnia to exit #44 for Rt. 9. Go north on Rt. 9 about 1/4 mile to Rt. 7. Turn right (east) on Rt. 7 and go about 2 miles to where Rt. 7 turns north (left). Go north on Rt. 7 about 4 1/2 miles to Arkona. In Arkona, turn right at the traffic light on Rt. 12 and go about 2 miles to the Hungry Hollow Rd. There is a small green, arrow-shaped Hungry Hollow sign on your right just before the Hungry Hollow Road but it is easily missed. Turn left on Hungry Hollow Rd. and go a little more than 1/2 mile to a steel bridge over the Ausable River. Cross the steel bridge and turn left onto a small gravel road just at the north end of the bridge. There is room here near the entrance to the gravel road for several cars to park along the side of the road and this is where we will meet. The clay pits where we will collect are beyond a gate at the end of the road.

AUGUST POT-LUCK PICNIC AT MORRISON LAKE, AUGUST 17th

There will be a pot-luck picnic hosted by Richard and Lila Stevens on Saturday, August 17th at their summer place on Morrison Lake.

The picnic will begin at 1:00 PM. Bring lawn chairs, folding tables, FOOD and eating equipment.

Directions: Take I-96 west towards Grand Rapids to the Lake Odessa exit (#64). Go south 1/2 mile to Portland Rd. and turn right. Go west on Portland Rd. for 3 miles to Jackson Rd. Turn left (south) onto Jackson Rd. and travel about 1/2 mile alongside of a golf course to Elm Rd. which is a private drive in the pine trees. Follow Elm Rd. around the lake until you smell the food and reach 291 Elm Road!
