EXTRA HIGH POLISH: To put an extra high polish on a cabochon or a flat, first polish in the normal manner, then buff with a used sheet of "Bounce," (trademark) or a similar fabric softener sheet. A used sheet seems to work better than a new one (it has been transformed by heat in the drying process). I have not tried other brands, but I believe the result should be the same. This trick has worked for me on several different materials. The result is a noticeable increased shine. I do not know if it is the chemical agent or the texture of the sheet...whatever the reason, it works.

Also from the *Leaverite News*, 4/2012

Ivory Soap Flakes ("Ivory Snow") was discontinued in 1993. Fortunately the Ivory pure soap bars are still being made. Just grate the soap, the slotted grate is easier than the other side with the holes. The grated soap can be used for that cleaning tumble cycle just before the polish. Note: I found the soap was very tough to wash out of my food processor. Even after the dishwasher some additional cleanup was necessary.

Modify Tools for Prong Setting: When setting stones in a prong mount avoid slipping by grinding a groove in the face of your prong pusher or one jaw of your flat-nose pliers. Easiest way to cut the slot on the pusher is with a file, and the easiest way to cut the slot on your pliers is with a cutoff wheel in the Foredom.

Use a Spray Bottle: Those little spray bottles you can find at the drug store are great for firescale preventors and debubbling solutions. A quick firescale preventor is liquid flux, and a homemade debubbling solution is a little Dawn liquid in rubbing alcohol.
